

How The Blue Jays Got Here: Johns Hopkins advanced to its eighth Sectional Semi-Final appearance in 13 tournaments after a 2-0 win over Misericordia University and a 0-0 draw with Salisbury University, which led to a 5-3 PK advancement in favor of the Blue Jays. . .it is the second consecutive year that Hopkins has advanced to the "Sweet 16" on PKs, and the program's third appearance in the previous four years. . .JHU has played its last nine postseason games (Centennial and NCAA Tournament) and 11 of their last 13 on the road, going 7-1-3 in those games. . .The Blue Jays punched their ticket to the Big Dance after winning its eighth overall Centennial Conference title, their third in the last four years. . .the Third Round matchup between Messiah and Johns Hopkins is the fourth meeting between the two schools, all in the NCAA tournament. . .JHU has gone 0-1-2 in the series.

How The Yellowjackets Got Here: After gaining a share of the University Athletic Association title and a wacky three-way tie break system, Rochester got the UAA's automatic bid into the NCAA Tournament for the fifth straight season — marking the school's 12th overall appearance. . .after receiving a First Round bye, the Yellowjackets defeated Plattsburgh State in the Second Round by a 3-0 score, all coming off free-kicks. . .ranked eighth in the final *D3soccer.com* Top 25 poll, Rochester is hoping to advance to the Final Four after being knocked out the previous two tournaments by host Messiah College. . .RU has posted 11 shutouts on the year and have gone 5-1-3 in nine games away from Fauver Stadium, outscoring their opponents 9-4 in those games.

How The Falcons Got Here: After a First Round bye and a 3-1 win over visiting The College at Brockport, Messiah enters the Third Round of the NCAA Tournament for the sixth straight season. . .The top-ranked Falcons are making their 13 straight NCAA appearance after a 4-1 win over Arcadia University in the Commonwealth Conference Championship game. . .Messiah won last year's NCAA Championship — the program's sixth title in nine years — after a 1-1, 3-0 PK decision over Stevens Tech in the final. . .the Falcons are looking to reach the National Semi-Finals for the ninth time in 10 seasons this weekend. . .Shoemaker Field has been a generous host for the Falcons this year, as they have outscored their opponents 56-6 on their home pitch.

About Wesleyan...

How The Cardinals Got Here: After making their third NCAA National Tournament appearance this year, Wesleyan University advances to their first Sectional Semi-Finals appearance in school history. . .a 2-0 win against St. Joe's College last Saturday and a 1-1, double-overtime 5-4 PK decision over Western New England College led the Cardinals into the Third Round. . .this is the first time that Wesleyan has gone without a loss after two NCAA Tournament games, going 1-1 in both its '05 and '06 trips. . . When Rochester and Wesleyan meet on Saturday afternoon, it will be the first meeting between the two schools. . .WU has posted 13 shutouts on the year, led behind freshman keeper Adam Purdy, who is ranked among the top ten nationally in save percentage (.906) and goals-against average (0.43).
