How The Red Devils Got Here: Dickinson makes its second appearance in the NCAA Tournament, earning at-large bids in 2005 and again this season. . . Dickinson survived a shootout in its opening round game with Centenary College before storming past Stevens Institute of Technology, 5-1, in the Second Round match up. . . the Red Devils have made three straight appearances in the Centennial Conference Championship game, earning the conference regular-season title this fall with a 9-1 record. . . the Red Devils set multiple school records this season, winning 12 straight games and posting 13 shut outs. . . they also set another school mark with seven consecutive shut outs as well.

How The Falcons Got Here: Messiah advanced to the NCAA Sectional Round via two 4-0 wins last weekend, defeating Manhattanville College and Rowan University. . . the Falcons have been atop the NSCAA/ *Hendrickcars.com* and *D3soccer.com* Top 25 Polls all season, backed by the top ranked offense and defense in all of NCAA Division III. . . last year, Messiah was met with some opposition, winning four NCAA games by one goal each on their way to the program's third national championship and second consecutive. . . Messiah is familiar to all the teams in this Sectional pod, being Dickinson and Johns Hopkins earlier this season, 6-0 and 2-1 respectively, while the Falcons knocked out TCNJ in last season's national semi-finals. . . Messiah has outscored thier opponents 107-2 this year, including an impressive 61-0 margin on Shoemaker Field.

How The Blue Jays Got Here: #12 Johns Hopkins is making its ninth NCAA Tournament appearance this fall and sixth consecutive. . . JHU defeated Farmingdale State University and Hamilton College to advance to the 'Sweet 16' for the third straight year. . . Hopkins advanced to the 'Elite Eight' in 2009, the deepest post-season run in school history, before bowing out to eventual national champion Messiah, 3-1. . . Hopkins defeated Dickinson College in the Centennial Conference Championship game for the third straight season, 3-0, to earn the conference's automatic bid to this year's NCAA's. . . The Blue Jays have won six straight Centennial Conference titles overall.

How The Lions Got Here: TCNJ is making its 20th straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament as they earned the New Jersey Athletic Conference's automatic bid to the tournament this year. . . the Lions were ranked 11th in the final NSCAA Division III Top 25 poll. . . TCNJ served as a host site for the opening two rounds of NCAA action, posting a 4-0 shutout of Christopher Newport University and a 3-0 victory against Ithaca College to advance to this weekend. . . the Lions have made it to the 'Final Four' in four of the last five years, finishing as the national runner-up in 2005 and 2006. . . TCNJ faced Johnson Hopkins University earlier this season, falling to the Blue Jays 2-0 back on October 20. . . since that game, TCNJ has won six in a row while outscoring the opposition, 17-1.
