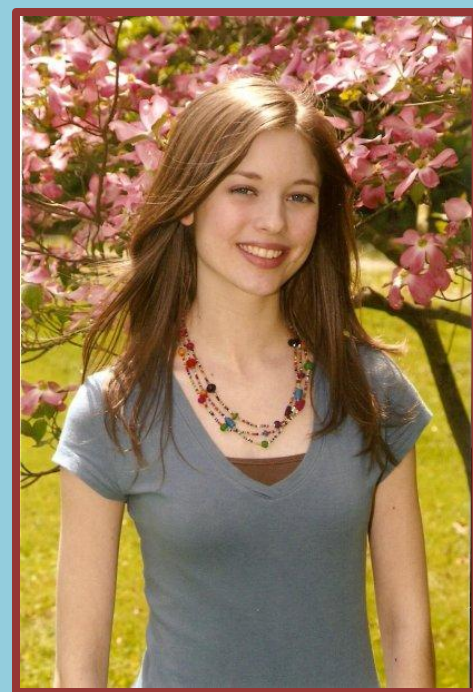

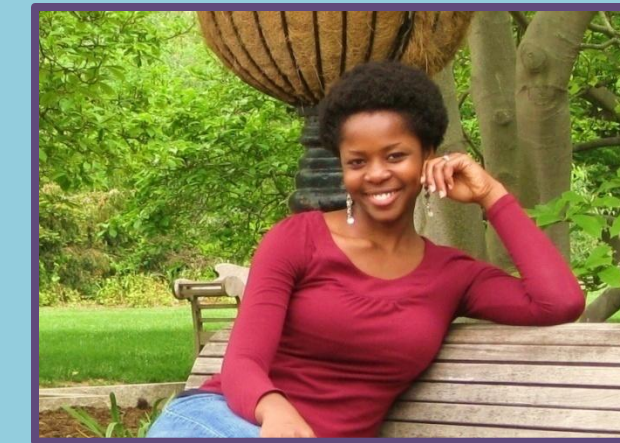
I discovered FCSE when taking a child development class in high school. A soon-to-be Messiah College graduate was doing her student teaching in my school.

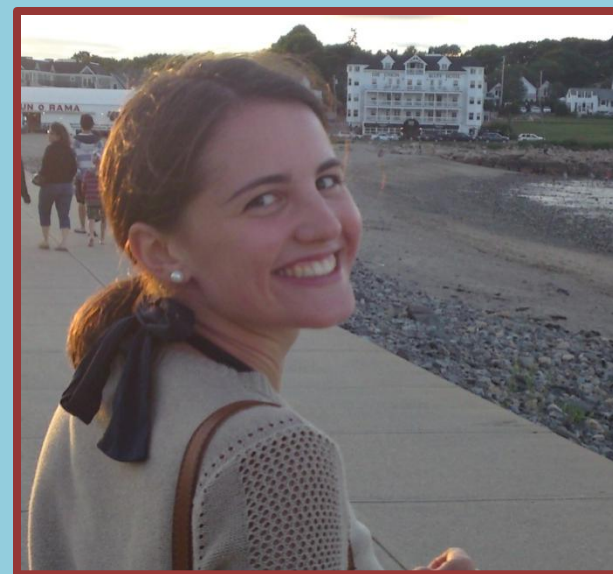

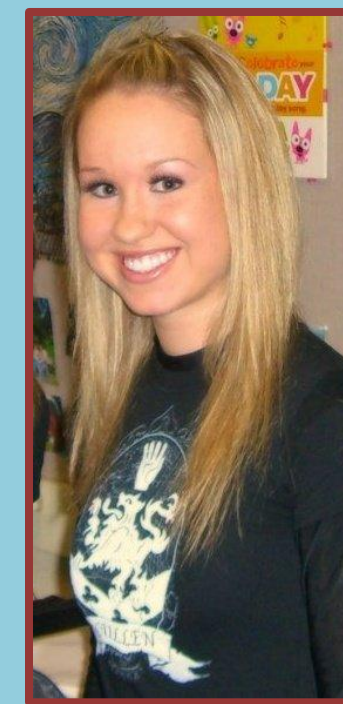

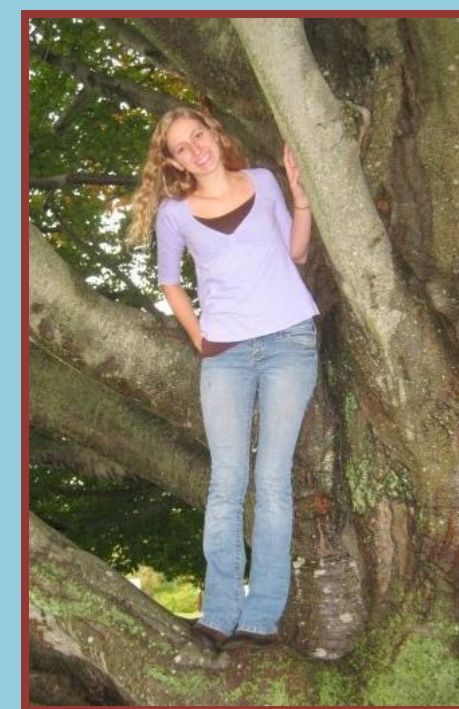
