

Professionals can earn six hours of approved continuing education with a focus on ethics in the following disciplines:

Social Work, Counseling, and Marriage and Family Therapy

Messiah College offers an undergraduate social work program accredited by the Council on Social Work Education and is therefore a pre-approved provider for continuing education courses for social workers, clinical social workers, licensed professional counselors, and marriage and family therapists in Pennsylvania. This program is awarded six hours of continuing education in the ethics category.

Psychology

Philhaven is approved by the American Psychological Association to offer continuing education for psychologists. Philhaven maintains responsibility for the program. This program is awarded six hours of approved continuing education for psychologists that will satisfy the ethics requirements for psychologists. Participants must attend the entire conference and complete an evaluation form in order to receive a certificate of attendance.

Certified Family Life Education

This program has been approved for six contact hours (.6 CEUs) for the Certified Family Life Educator program through the National Council on Family Relations.

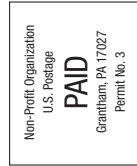
PA Teachers

This program has been approved for six hours of continuing education for the Act 48 Regulations by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

This conference has been designed to provide a forum in which participants can learn about important ethical principles involved in considering the incorporation of the Bible in psychotherapy, along with implications for assessment and informed consent procedures. Participants can also learn sample techniques that incorporate the Bible and consider how client diagnostic features impact these strategies.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES: Upon the conclusion of this seminar, participants should be able to:

1. Describe how therapist competency, client wishes, informed consent, and client welfare interact in ethical decision-making regarding Scripture-focused strategies in psychotherapy.
2. Discuss how personal values, treatment setting, cultural sensitivity, and value-imposition precautions interact in ethical decision-making regarding Bible-related treatment strategies in psychotherapy.
3. Explain ethically appropriate assessment strategies that are needed prior to Scripture-focused interventions with clients.
4. Apply ethical decision-making principles in the consideration of Scripture-focused interventions.
5. Describe the following Scripture-focused intervention strategies: Implicit, psychoeducational, theoeducational, behavioral, cognitive, and affective/experiential.
6. Integrate the client's diagnostic features in the application of these interventions.
7. Discuss how client personal features (such as religious background) influence the application of Bible-related interventions.
