









- The Collaboratory for Strategic Research and Applied **Partnerships** enables students to apply academic knowledge and live out their Christian faith through imaginative, handson problem solving that meets the needs of clients around the world. In 2012, World Vision awarded the Collaboratory a \$733,000 grant to further improve water and sanitation access for disabled individuals in rural Africa.
- Through the Harrisburg Institute, Messiah provides access to Christian higher education in an urban setting where students can live and serve in the city.
- The Center for Public Humanities brings together academic, civic and cultural communities to engage contemporary issues and to promote learning through symposia, lectures, film series, conferences and partnerships with school districts and literacy outreach programs.
- The School of the Arts fosters extensive connections with visiting artists and arts organizations internationally and locally, such as the Harrisburg Symphony Orchestra. Messiah also contributes to the cultural life of the region through affiliations with its accomplished artists-in-residence: jazz musician Tim Warfield, the Susquehanna Chorale and the Mendelssohn Piano Trio.
- Messiah's Oakes Museum of Natural History features Smithsonian-quality collections of seashells, birds and bird eggs, minerals and fossils as well as 144 full-body mounts of North American and African wildlife. Last year the museum had more than 15,000 visitors.



athletic achievements and championships

Messiah College sets standards for excellence in NCAA Division III college programs while developing the Christian character of its athletes. Our athletes turn in All-American performances and have been featured in USA Today, Sports Illustrated, nytimes.com, NCAA.com and on national network television.

- The Messiah Falcons are nine-time NCAA Division III national champions in men's soccer (2012, 2010, 2009, 2008, 2006, 2005, 2004, 2002 and 2000); five-time national champions in women's soccer (2012, 2011, 2009, 2008 and 2005); 2009 national champions in softball; two-time national runners-up in women's basketball; and eight-time national runners-up in field hockey. In 2010, track star Kristen Bates '10 won national championships in the 55- and 100-meter hurdles and the pentathlon, becoming the College's most individually decorated athlete.
- The Falcons had nine student-athletes earn College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-District honors in the 2012-2013 season for maintaining at least a 3.3 GPA and playing at least 50 percent of their team's games at a primary position. Five of the recognized studentathletes went on to be named All-Americans, the most-ever for Messiah in a single year.
- In 2010, Chris Heisey '08 debuted with the Cincinnati Reds, becoming the first Messiah alumnus to play in the major leagues.
