Greetings Counseling Students! As we look to the fast-approaching fall semester, I wanted to highlight a few updates we have recently made to the Graduate Program in Counseling requirements:

Professional Memberships

All counseling students are required to become student members of one of the following professional organizations before beginning Practicum:

- American Counseling Association (ACA)
- American School Counselor Association (ASCA)
- American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy (AAMFT)

Previously, students were required to be a member of ACA. However, beginning this fall, students will be able to choose from one of the above professional organizations.

TB Testing for School Counseling Students

School Counseling students are required to have a current TB test before beginning a Practicum or Internship. This test should be no more than one year old, unless otherwise specified by your site. Please send a copy of your TB screening results to the Practicum and Internship Coordinator before the start of your on-site hours.
