Visit with Don Tate

Don Tate, acclaimed author and illustrator, visited Murray Library on November 11th and gave an engaging presentation that captivated attendees of all ages. The event began with Don sharing stories from his childhood and his journey into the world of illustration, encouraging the young audience to reflect on their own talents and strengths.

One of the highlights of the night was Don's reading from *Poet*, his powerful picture book about the life of enslaved poet George Moses Horton. Don explained how he used whimsy in his illustrations to balance the serious themes of the book, making the difficult topic of enslavement

more accessible to young readers. He also highlighted how direct quotes from Horton's poetry are incorporated into the artwork, bringing the historical voice Horton to life in a unique way.

The session concluded with a Q&A, followed by a doodling session where Don invited the young attendees to participate, sparking their imagination.

This event was attended by a diverse group of about forty-two attendees, including alumni, MU employees, families, and students. It was a wonderful celebration of creativity and storytelling! A special thanks to Todd Allen for making this visit possible.

Stream Christmas Music from Naxos Online

Need a festive soundtrack for wrapping presents and trimming the tree? Music streaming database, <u>Naxos</u>, contains many imaginative and beautiful albums of carols and other Christmas music, from ancient to modern. Many of the albums are by critically acclaimed choirs and orchestras. Stream an entire album or create a personal account for setting up playlists. This service is available to all Messiah students and staff, on or off campus. The database contains full recordings for all seasons throughout the year, including over 2.7 million state-of-the-art classical music tracks. Note, off campus access is limited to MU students, faculty, and staff.

Ancestry.com (library edition)

As the holiday season approaches, you might be curious about your family's history and the branches of your family tree. Murray Library has access to <u>Ancestry.com (Library</u> <u>Edition)</u>. By using the link provided here, your Messiah University login information gets you **on- and off-campus access** to census, immigration, marriage, and military records, plus user-submitted family trees.

Please note that this library edition of Ancestry is slightly different than a personal, paid Ancestry subscription. Also, check out our <u>genealogy research guide</u> for other FREE online resources to help you get started. Family history can be a great conversation starter at the holidays!

Engle Memorial Collection

The book, *A Child's Christmas in Wales*, is part of the library's Ruth E. Engle Memorial Collection of Children's Book Illustration. Dylan Thomas is the author and Chris Raschka, the illustrator. The year of publication is 2004.

When Chris Raschka creates a picture book, he starts with a very clear understanding of his audience: children. "I consider them to be very much the same as adults," he says. "Which is to say that I consider myself to be very much the same now.... I don't feel that the me of thirty years ago is much different from the me of today.... This view of my childhood definitely influences my work." *School Library Journal* observed that his "simple lines and squiggles of color suggest a child's own drawings, but this is the art of a masterful hand."

Raschka has illustrated more than sixty books, including *Yo! Yes?* in 1994, for which he received a Caldecott Honor, and *The Hello, Goodbye Window* in 2005, which garnered a Caldecott Medal and a host of other awards.
