Over the summer of 2021, the DPT program worked as a team to write a self-study report for initial accreditation. The report consisted of written narratives to 220 different elements within 8 different standards. This required a tremendous amount of effort from the team. Due to a change in leadership, what normally takes a year or more was accomplished in 2 months! The site-visit team was extremely impressed and found zero deficiencies in the report during the visit. As of this printing, the report is being presented at the spring CAPTE meeting for a final vote to grant accreditation prior to our first cohort graduating in May. The DPT program not only benefits Messiah (with 36 new students each year), but will also fill a need in the local community with new healthcare practitioners.
