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





SYNOPSIS:

Two aspiring actresses who double as roommates work tirelessly toward their big break together. NOTES FROM THE CREATORS:

Many often underestimate the true power of art. Emotions can be captured through art, whether it's on stage or on the screen. It can motivate, inspire, provoke deep reflection, and transform viewpoints. I fell in love with musical theatre for these reasons. Inspired by my late Uncle Paul Eckstein, a TV writer, I looked forward to the opportunity to write a meaningful story of my own. Working with Ella on this show has been incredibly rewarding as we have grown in our friendship and learned so much about the creating process and our own skills as performers. Ella and I have our own strengths, but we also have weaknesses. We complete each other as my weaknesses are her strengths and vice versa. We ended up learning more from each other than we thought possible as we pushed each other to be better in multiple ways.

We wanted to create a story that was exuberant, meaningful and got the audience to think from a new perspective. We also wanted to implement what it's like to have a relationship with Jesus in the show in a way that was relatable but also reminded others of God's goodness and his plan for our lives. God's plan is greater than our own, and he knows what's best for us, but this can be hard to remember as we face the trials and tribulations of life. This was one of the most important aspects for me when creating this piece because while the desire to perform consumes my heart, the desire to follow, serve, and praise Jesus is at the forefront of my life. BY THE BOG OF CATS Written by Marina Carr, Directed by Daniel Inouve

Loosely based on Euripides' tragedy Medea, this is the prophetic tale of Hester Swane, an Irish Traveller, who attempts to come to terms with a lifetime of abandonment in a world where all whom she has loved have discarded her. Set on the bleak, ghostly landscape of the Bog of Cats, this provocative drama discloses one woman's courageous attempts to lay claim to that which is hers, as her world is torn in two. Hester's long-term lover, Carthage Kilbride, with whom she has a seven-year-old daughter, is selling her "down the river" for the promise of land and wealth through a marriage with the local big farmer's daughter. In the final moments of the action, we witness a woman provoked beyond the limits of human endurance. By the Bog of Cats is a furious, uncompromising tale of greed and betrayal, of murder and profound self-sacrifice.
