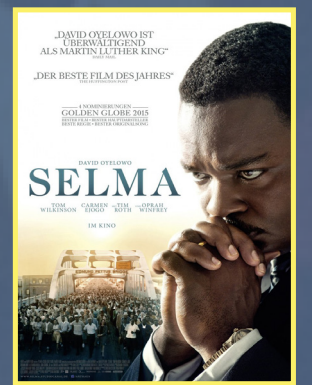
#### SAB LOST FILM - SELMA
