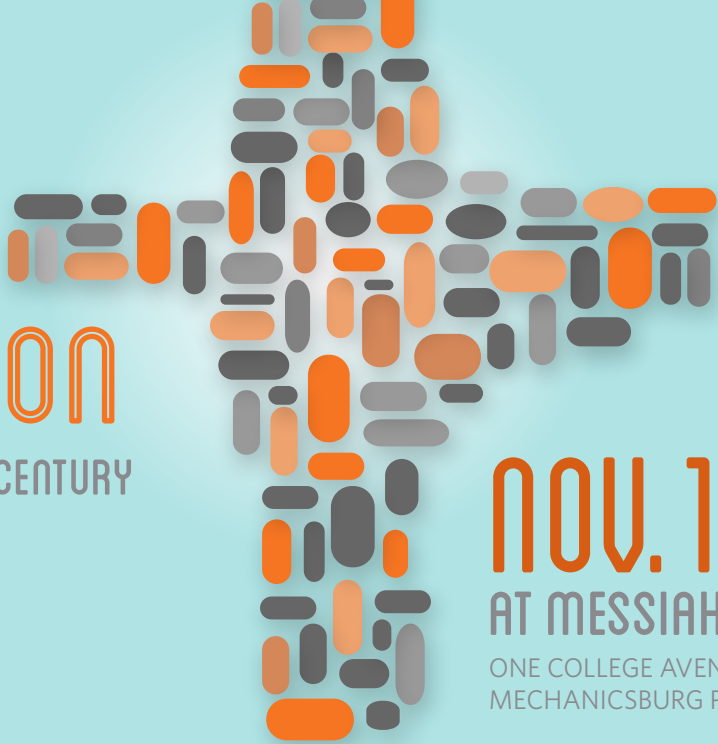

Dr. Roger E. Olson is the Foy Valentine Professor of Christian Theology of Ethics at George W. Truett Theological Seminary of Baylor University. A self-described “evangelical Arminian,” Olson is a recognized expert

in historical theology. He holds degrees from the North American Baptist Seminary (M.A.,1978) and Rice University (M.A.,1982; Ph.D., 1984). He is the author of numerous books, including “Reclaiming Pietism: Retrieving an Evangelical Tradition” (2014) with Christian Collins-Winn, and “The Journey of Modern Theology: From Reconstruction to Deconstruction” (2013). The Sider Institute for Anabaptist, Pietist and Wesleyan Studies annually holds a study conference for Brethren in Christ pastors, lay people and friends from theologically related denominations. This year, the conference will focus on the theme, “Life Beyond the Congregation: The Future of Denominations in the 21st Century.” The conference will begin Thursday, Nov. 12 with an opening keynote talk in the evening, and will continue all day Friday, Nov. 13.

The conference will address questions such as:

- *What happened to denominations in North America? Why are they on the decline?*
- *Are denominations still relevant in the 21st century?*
- *What is the future of denominations in a postmodern, post-Christian context?*
- *Do Christians need to belong to something bigger than the local congregation?*

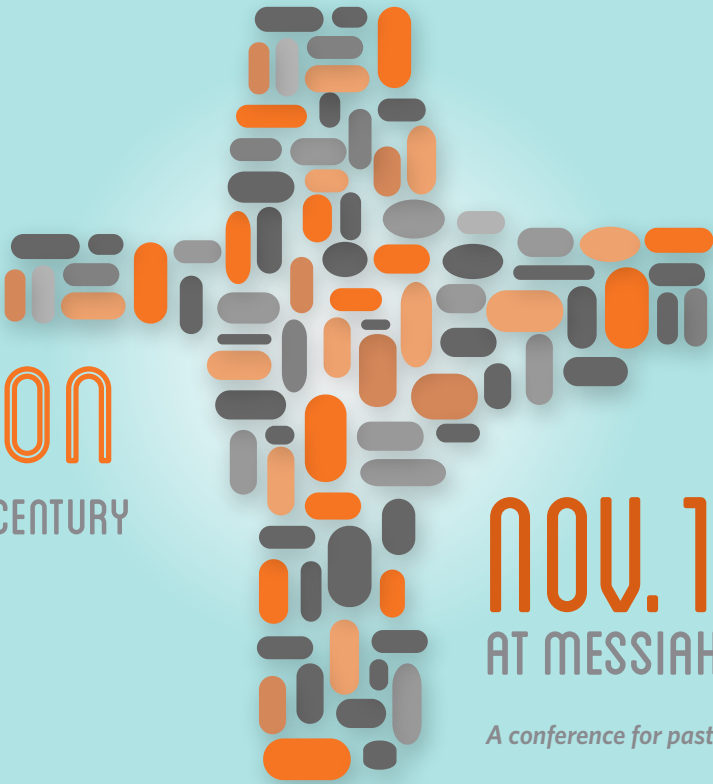
