What is an internship?

- Semester-long, supervised work experience related to your major or career goals
- Part-time or full-time, paid or unpaid
- Important elements:
 - intentional self-directed learning strategy
 - faith integration in work setting
 - emphasis on professional development

Why do an internship for credit?

- Develop personal and professional skills
- Protect yourself legally
- Develop a Masterwork Portfolio
- Highlight your self-directed learning ability
- Great for job and graduate school interviews!

How many credits can I earn?

- Earn between 4 and 12 credits (4-10 in Summer)
- Minimum 12 weeks in length
- Minimum of 10 hours per week
