Standardized Test	 The Pharmacy College Admissions Test (PCAT) is required by approximately 2/3 of all pharmacy schools. The PCAT is a specialized test that helps identify qualified applicants to pharmacy colleges. It measures general academic ability and scientific knowledge necessary for graduate-level pharmaceutical education. The test is offered on one or more dates in July, September, October, November, and January.
