Fall Break Service Trips!

Catholic Charities (Baltimore, MD): A national organization that offers support to member agencies, provides disaster relief and promotes poverty reduction through research and legislative reform. Volunteers will assist with meal programs, after school tutoring programs, and immigration assistance programs.

Priority 1 Ministries (Bronx, NY): Some students may be serving in a storehouse organizing food and other materials for distribution while others may be directly interacting with homeless communities. Still others will have the opportunity to work with children in an after school tutoring program.

Steinbruck Center (Washington, D.C.): Provides transformative education, service-learning, research, and training opportunities for people to address the root causes of homelessness and urban poverty.

Urban Tree Connection (Philadelphia, PA) & PA State Park System (Local): Participants will have an opportunity to explore the interconnectedness of social and environmental issues, in both an urban and rural setting. Also, participants will have an opportunity to support local reforestation efforts by serving with the Department of Conservation & Natural Resources.
