## **III. MODERN LANGUAGES**

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## **Curriculum for Study Abroad**

## Chinese Studies Major

Pre-requisite CHIN 202. Students should complete 12-15 credits of approved Chinese language courses and zero to three credits of Chinese literature, history, culture, art history, philosophy, or political science during the semester in CIEE Shanghai, China. These courses should be directly related to the target culture. Students should confirm with the Department of Modern Languages that the courses they select are approved for the Chinese major or minor.

#### **Chinese Business Major**

Pre-requisite CHIN 202. Students should complete 9-12 credits of approved Chinese language courses and three to six credits of Chinese business or economic courses during the semester in CIEE Shanghai, China. These courses should be directly related to the target culture. Students should confirm with the Department of Modern Languages that the courses they select are approved for the Chinese major.

#### **French Major**

Pre-requisite FREN 206. Students should complete 12-18 credits of approved courses during the semester in Paris, France. Students must take at least one course in French language, and should select the rest from among courses in literature, history, culture, art history, philosophy, or political science. These courses should be directly related to the target culture. Students should confirm with the Department of Modern Languages that the courses they select are approved for the French major or minor.

#### **Spanish Major**

Pre-requisite SPAN 206. Students should complete 12 - 18 credits of approved Spanish courses during the semester at the Pontificia Universidad Católica de Valparaíso, Chile or Universidad de Granada, Spain. Students must take at least one Spanish language and one Spanish literature course (Latin American or Spanish peninsular), and should select among courses in literature, history, culture, art history, philosophy, or political science. These courses should be directly related to the target culture. Students should confirm with the Department of Modern Languages that the courses selected are approved for Spanish major and minor credit.

### **Spanish Business Major**

Pre-requisite SPAN 206. Students should complete 12-18 credits of approved Spanish courses during the semester at the Pontíficia Universidad Católica de Valparaiso, Chile or Universidad de Granada, Spain. Students must take two courses in business or economics. Students will also select additional courses in language, literature, history, culture, art history, philosophy or political science. Students should confirm with the Department of Modern Languages that the courses selected are approved for Spanish Business credit.
