Purchasing/Production Manager — The department of dining services currently has an opening for the position of purchasing/production manager. This is a full-time, 12-month, administrative position. This position is responsible for the management and oversight of all administrative details of CBORD software functions such as menu cost analysis, recipe control, item maintenance and assisting in the menu planning process. Other responsibilities include: purchasing management, inventory control, nutrition analysis, issuing inter-unit transfer controls and purchasing needs for the dining services department. The purchasing/production manager works with all segments of dining services to ascertain specifications and then competitively purchase products that meet these specs. Education required include an associate's degree in culinary arts or business; nationally accredited culinary program degree preferred. Required experience includes: two years of related culinary experience or management in high-volume hotel or institutional culinary setting; culinary school training in nationally acclaimed culinary program with demonstrated culinary skills specifically related to purchasing; knowledge of foods and supplies, and how each application fits the needs of the dining service role; proficient in computer skills, with working knowledge of office software including Word, Excel, and menu management software; ability to work with confidential matters regarding personnel and financial data; ability to analyze cost comparisons and understand comparison values against specification; excellent organizational skills; extensive understanding of foods and recipes; strong mathematical ability; ability to run and understand financial reports.
