

How to Find Pre-1950 Periodical Articles

In addition to research in current or recent periodicals, some researchers find that they need to use older sources. Often, early magazines, journals, or newspapers are excellent primary sources. They may present the original thoughts on a topic; may serve as documentation of prevailing views in a particular time period; or may offer visual evidence of popular culture.

I. GENERAL AND MULTIDISCIPLINARY INDEXES

a. Humanities and Social Sciences Retrospective (1907-1984)

Coverage includes a wide range of interdisciplinary fields covering a broad array of humanities and social sciences journals.

b. Reader's Guide Retrospective (1890-1982)

The most popular general-interest periodicals published in the United States. (See list on page 2.)

c. Book Review Digest Retrospective (1905-1982)

Database includes excerpts from, and citations to, reviews of adult and juvenile fiction and non-fiction.

d. JSTOR (Early 19th-present)

Complete back runs of core scholarly journals beginning with the first issues and continuing to within 3-5 years of the present.

II. SUBJECT-SPECIFIC INDEXES

a. PsycInfo (1887-present)

Covers psychology and related fields; includes journal articles, technical reports, monographs, dissertations, etc.

b. SocIndex (1895-present)

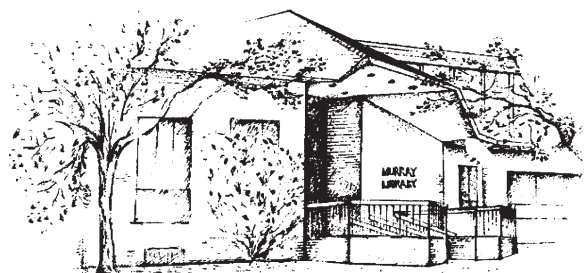
Covers more than 500 core journals in the social sciences, plus books, conference papers, etc.

c. MLA International Bibliography (1926-present)

Covers literature, languages, linguistics, and folklore worldwide.

d. Religion Index (also called ATLAS) (1949-present)

Covers more than 500 international journals, plus books and book chapters, in religion and related fields.
