

SYNOPSIS

Rachel Bublitz's one-act play, *The Red House Monster*, chronicles the story of Hannah Gold, a young lady living on an island off the coast of Massachusetts in the late 1800s, and the night that changed her life. Filled with small town lore, haunted houses, spirits, monsters, pistols, pie, and mysteries, it is a play that will keep you guessing just what is in the Red House, and who, in fact, you should be afraid of.

Ever since I was a little girl, I have always been infatuated with stories, listening to them, reading them, telling them, anything I could do to get connected to characters and learn about their lives. As I got older, my passion for storytelling only continued to grow, and I knew that this is what I wanted to do with my life. As a director, this is my ultimate goal, to tell stories that people will leave the performance being impacted by, and that is what I wanted to challenge myself to do for this senior project.

This process has been nowhere near close to easy. I originally had another show picked out, but after not having enough people show up for auditions, and then not being able to find the people to fill the cast,

I had to change my show. Through the frantic searching for a new one act that I was interested in the story, and could be feasibly be put together in one month, I stumbled across *The Red House Monster*. I was immediately infatuated with this story for a multitude of reasons. It was a story of suspense, myths and legends, telling stories from generation to generation, and keeps the audience on the edge of their seats through the entire performance; but more importantly, the underlying messages are truly beautiful, and gives the show so much purpose and meaning. Even through the funny moments, the scary bits, and suspense of constantly wondering where the plot is going to go, the messages of not judging others, the significance of family, and bravery and determination in all of us pushes through.

I hope as you watch this show, you can enjoy the story for what it is, a suspenseful thriller of a mystical monster and a girl trying to save her sister, but can walk away seeing yourself in these characters, and being impacted by the relationships built in the show, and allow yourself to grow and change how you view and interact with those around you.


