

Students must graduate from accredited social work programs to be licensed in each state to practice social work.



Advanced Standing for MSW

 Our BSW grads qualify for advanced standing status in an accredited Master of Social Work (MSW) program. Our BSW grads can go on to earn MSW in just one year.*

*Non-BSW grads enrolled in an accredited MSW program require two years, full-time to receive MSW.




Preparing for a social work profession spiritual formation and development
