The Messiah Men's Soccer Crest

The Messiah Men's Soccer program has had several crests over the years. The crest shown to the right is its most recent rendition.

At the top of the crest are the words "As Iron Sharpens Iron," which is a reference to Proverbs 27:17: "As iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another." This is an integral part of the Men's Soccer team and represents the desire to hold each other accountable both on and off the field.

In the middle of the crest is the rendition of a falcon, which is Messiah College's official mascot. In front of the falcon is a shield with a cross, which is representative of the program's goal to play "in front of an audience of one."

In 1999, Assistant Coach Fred Winey created a crest that had been used in recent years, with stars added for each National Championship won. The most recent crest to the right shows 10 stars to account for titles in 2013, 2012, 2010, 2009, 2008, 2006, 2005, 2004, 2002 and 2000. There are also two stars on the interior of the crest (added in 2011) that reflect the program's National Christian College Athletic Association (NCCAA) National Championships, won in 1978 and 1981.

In 2013 the bronze coloring was changed to silver to align with the relaunching of the Athletics' visual identity standards, which added silver as an official accent color of the Falcons. The "Messiah" word mark was also brought out of the crest to be displayed in higher visibility along the bottom of the mark.

Jake Tassy '93, a former player, had created one of the earliest crests that was used from 1992 to 1998.
