8-semester plans are a suggested course sequence to be used as a guideline for degree completion. Students should work carefully with academic advisors to build an individual plan, using the 8-semester plan as a tool along with the degree audit and semester course schedules. 8-semester plans do not guarantee course offerings or available seats.

Full-time undergraduate students must be registered for 12-18 credits of degree requirements per semester, including free electives, in order to qualify for full financial aid. (Reduced aid is possible for some students enrolled in less than 12 credits. Students should consult with the Financial Aid office to determine the effect on their financial aid before enrolling in fewer than 12 credits). The undergraduate degree must include at least 123 credits by completion – this means that electives are required for some programs.
