RE: Al-related Policies and Resources

Please be reminded of the following AI-related policies for your classes, as well as resources that are available to assist you in your work.

Syllabus Requirements

Two syllabus-related requirements were reviewed and approved by COE Senate during the 2024-2025 academic year and are effective this fall.

- Statement on Student AI Use All instructors must include a statement in each of their course syllabi about student use of AI tools in that course. Instructors may (a) use one of the sample syllabus statements posted on the <u>Faculty Resource and Support Canvas site</u>; (b) use a syllabus statement that has been developed by their academic department or program; or (c) develop and use their own syllabus statement. All statements must specify the range of allowable use, provide a rationale for that range of use, and refer to the University's academic integrity policy.
- AI-Assisted Assignment Evaluation: If you are using an AI tool to assist in the evaluation of student work, you must provide a syllabus statement that tells students when the tool will be used and how the tool's feedback will be used in assessing their work. Use of such a tool must follow the policy outlined in the <u>COE Handbook</u> (see "Grading" in Section 8 and Section 10).

Canvas Al Tools

Canvas has added two Al-powered tools to assist you. Because they are in Canvas's testing phase, they have not been enabled University-wide, but you can enable them in your Canvas courses if you wish:

- Smart Search, which is available to both instructors and students, allows users to search Canvas course content to locate information within a course (see Smart Search FAQ).
- Discussion Summaries, which is available only to instructors, provides instructors with summaries of key points, questions, and ideas in a discussion thread (see <u>About</u> <u>Discussion Summaries</u>).
