Although there is no precise "profile" of an active shooter, there are indicators that should not be ignored.





BE PROACTIVE



RISK INDICATORS

- Uncharacteristic mood swings
 - Increased/unexplained absences
 - Inattentiveness to appearance/hygiene
 - Explosive outbursts without provocation
 - Frequent comments about injustices/being mistreated





RISK INDICATORS

- Comments about suicide/putting things in order
 - Obsessive interest in other mass shootings



- Expressions of paranoia/irrationality
 - Making threats of doing harm
 - Other unusual behaviors



One indicator alone does not mean someone will become an active shooter.




But as they accumulate, the risk increases.



RUN



- ✓ Leave your belongings behind.
- ✓ Run in a zig-zag pattern away from the direction of the shooter.
- ✓ Keep your hands up.



RUN



- ✓ Don't just run *from* danger; run *to* safety
 - Far from the area
 - Out of sight
 - Behind structures/objects that deter bullet penetration
 - Never return to the danger zone for any reason



HIDE



- ✓ Lock/secure doors
- ✓ Blockade doors with heavy items/furniture
- ✓ Turn off lights and silence all electronics



HIDE



- ✓ Do not huddle together
- Move away from glass doors/windows
- ✓ Go to where you cannot see the shooter
 - If you can see the shooter, they can probably see you



HIDE



- ✓ Don't pick up any weapons that you may find.
- ✓ Be mindful that if the fire alarm sounds, it could be the shooter trying to flush people out.
- ✓ Stay hidden until notified by University authorities and/or law enforcement.

FIGHT



- ✓ Personal decision
- ✓ Work together & improvise
- ✓ Don't stop until shooter is fully subdued.

✓ Where are our exits?

✓ Where could we run to?

✓ What could we use to fight?

✓ Who could we call?







Messiah University - Active Shooter Preparedness - Planning Template

The purpose of this document is to assist employees and students in Departments, Residences, Classrooms, Offices and other locations (Units) in establishing an 'area-specific' action plan in response to an Active Shooter(s) emergency. It is highly recommended that every member of your 'unit' help establish and/or review this plan. Establishing a plan will help to reduce confusion and panic should an actual shooting event occur.

As a reminder, when an active shooter(s) is in your area, your first move is to **RUN**. If that option is not available, you are to **HIDE**. If shooter has found you, last resort is to **FIGHT**

Establishing Your Plan: Questions to Answer

FIGHT RUN HIDE Identify/list all exits in your location: Identify doors to lock/barricade, and As a last resort and only when lives HOW they lock/can be secured: are in imminent danger. Utilize whatever improvised tools you can find: Work together to incapacitate Where would you go after exiting? shooter(s). Identify items in your location that could be used to incapacitate Identify and list all the areas in your shooter(s) and HOW you might use location that would conceal you from them: shooter's view – prime hiding locations. Remember: (Remember if you can see the shooter, Leave your belongings they can probably see you): Run in a zig-zag pattern away from direction of shooter Keep your hands up/ visible Run to safety (behind structures that repel bullets, out of sight, far from Identify heavy furniture / items to use Identify concerns among your group shooting) for barricading: related to FIGHTING Do not return for any reason **CALL or TEXT 911** AS YOU PLAN Remember: * ONLY IF SAFE TO DO SO * It is important to talk through this • Silence your cell phone plan with each member of your Close blinds/turn off lights Provide police with location of group. In addition to answering
