The Finance and Organizations Committee plays a critical role in managing and recommending SGA's semester budget by reviewing student organization funding requests, conducting budget audits, and evaluating club performance. In partnership with the Vice Presidents of Finance and Organizations, the committee ensures the financial health of SGA by presenting balanced budget proposals, reviewing capital purchases, and overseeing the Student Activities Fee.
