KEYNOTE SPEAKER



Dr. Drew Strait teaches the New Testament at Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary (Elkhart, Indiana). His writing focuses on peace and peacemaking in early Christianity, along with early Christian negotiation of political idolatry. He served as a pastor at Living Water Community Church, a Mennonite Church USA congregation in Chicago and as an elder at Peace Fellowship in Washington, D.C. before relocating to Indiana. Strait is married and has three children.

As Brethren in Christ, we believe that "loyalty to Christ and the church, which is transnational, takes precedence over loyalty to the state."

That conviction is increasingly difficult to declare and live out in today's political and cultural context. Many Christians believe that the United States was founded as a "Christian nation" and that America's ongoing prosperity requires preservation of this covenantal relationship. For pastors and church leaders, this kind of Christian nationalism constitutes idolatry, creates barriers to meaningful discipleship and threatens the integrity of the church's witness in the world.

This study conference seeks to address the challenges of ministering effectively in the midst of Christian nationalism. It will address such questions as:

- •What is Christian nationalism, and why is it a problem for U.S. churches today?
- •What biblical and theological resources exist for pastors and other church leaders who want to resist the influence of Christian nationalism in their congregations?
- •What are pastors and other church leaders already doing to address this issue? What more can be done?

CONFERENCE DETAILS

The conference "Confronting Christian Nationalism in Our Churches" is sponsored by the E. Morris and Leone Sider Institute for Anabaptist, Pietist and Wesleyan Studies at Messiah University. It will provide Brethren in Christ pastors, lay people and friends from related denominations with the opportunity to reflect on important issues in theologically informed ways.
